Here is the December update for Warfield from PCSO Michelle Noone.

Speed enforcement has been carried out in Warfield by PC Crawford over the past month. Thirty cars were stopped; 11 fixed penalty notices were issued and one driver was reported.

The speed indicator device (SID) is a temporary mobile interactive sign, which shows a smiley face if drivers are within the speed limit and a frown to remind them to slow down. The next speed watch using SID is currently being arranged and hopefully we can continue to carry out several per month, as this is a very effective device.

There have been a few reports of vehicles being broken into in and around the Warfield area and also Nuptown. Please remember not to leave valuables in your vehicle, even in the boot, as thieves are still breaking in and taking presents and electrical equipment.

Although anti-social behaviour (ASB) has not been identified as a priority issue in the neighbourhood, we have had several reports of vandalism in the memorial ground, which is being closely monitored. However, due to the colder and wetter weather, ASB is generally reducing. Please let us know if there are any issues where you live so that we can add them to the Lion Cub list and hold our briefings at that particular hotspot.

Every Friday and Saturday Operation Lion Cub continues to tackle anti-social behaviour in our area. Known hotspots are patrolled throughout the night, with appropriate action being taken. Therefore if you see or hear a group of people acting inappropriately or believe they are drinking alcohol or smoking under-age, please call the police on 0845 8 505 505 and officers will attend.

Littering continues to be monitored and seems to be improving. In the New Year, I will be looking at carrying out several EVA's (Environmental Visual Audit) with the local school children, whereby we go round the local area and look at ways of improving the appearance of our community.

The next Beat Surgery will be held from 10.30am to 11.30am on the 6th January in Tesco, Warfield, where you can find me or PC Crawford in the café area, so do come over and speak to us. So far the Beat Surgeries have been poorly attended but we will stay at this location and hope to speak to you all about any issues you may have in the Warfield area.
